

EYPP Report Spring 2019

There were 6 children with EYPP in Spring 2019. The total EYPP funds received was £667.80 (£111.30 each). There was also a 167.80 carry forward. TOTAL: £835.60. All children were N2 children and therefore all statistics/data refer to N2 children.

Children with EYPP will have rich experiences, which will inspire their development across the curriculum, particularly regarding their Communication and Language, Personal Social and Emotional Development and their Understanding of the World. This intent reflects the increasing understanding of 'the experience gap' many disadvantaged children have, which builds on research into 'the language gap'.
