Dear Parents and Carers,

Friday 17th November: School photographer taking individual portraits

The photographer will be in school to take individual portrait shots of the children and these will be taken in their regular nursery session for those that usually attend on a Friday. However, if you have a younger child(ren) and would like a sibling shot to be taken, then please wait after drop-off and let your child's group leader know so that these can be done first.



If your child does not usually attend nursery on a Friday but you would like them to have a photograph taken, please arrive between 9.00am and 9.30am and report to Reception so that we can ensure your child's photograph is taken before the nursery children; we will try to work through everyone as swiftly as possible, but please be advised there may be a bit of a wait!

During the covid-19 pandemic we began putting on our own pantomimes for the children here at Lydalls because we were unable to visit the theatre. We have a lot of fun putting on the performances and can see how much the children enjoy them — the Lydalls panto has therefore become a Christmas tradition! Our pantomimes are based on one of our core stories and include familiar phrases and songs for children to join in with. This year we will be putting on a show called 'Goldilocks and the 3 Reindeer'. There will be performances in both the morning and afternoon during the normal session times. Children will attend nursery as usual.

Wednesday 13th December: Party Day (main nursery only)




- We will be holding a Christmas party for the children on Wednesday 13th December from
- 8.45-11.45. This includes **ALL** children from **both the morning and afternoons**.
- There will be no afternoon session for afternoon only children. Please come to the party in the morning instead. If you have concerns about this please come and speak to me and I will do my very best to accommodate any alternative arrangements.
- We will be open as usual for 30 hour and all day children, as well as for the 2 year old base.
- We will have party food at 10.30am and ask for contributions of £2 per child towards this. We will have a festive basket at the door to collect donations nearer to the time, however please do not worry if you are unable to contribute.
- The children will perform their Christmas songs at 11.15am. Please do come and join us.
- After the party all 15 hours children will then go home. If your child normally stays until 3.45pm but you have come to watch the singing and would like to collect them early that day, you are welcome to do so. Any children staying all day will eat lunch a little later than usual due to having party food in the morning. Please keep in mind that they may eat less than usual from their lunch box due to enjoying party food earlier in the day.

2-Year-Old Base Parties

Due to the younger age of children in our 2-year-old base and because they do not all attend on the same day, children will have party activities throughout the week beginning 11.12.23 and enjoy a little party food at snack times.

Monday 18th December: Theatre trip to Cornerstones



- This year we are delighted to return to the Cornerstones theatre to see the show 'Heart of Winter', a musical production about a girl who goes in search of winter!
- Letters with attached permission slips will be given out soon. Please make sure you return your promptly.
- Tickets cost £10 per child, however we are supporting the financing of this trip for all children and ask for a voluntary donation of £5 per child. All other costs will be met by our 'Friends of Lydalls' fund (this is one of the things we raise money for during the year) and Early Years Pupil Premium.
- The performance begins at 10am for morning children and 1.30pm for afternoon children. We will be asking families of 15 hour children to meet us at the cornerstone and have made provision for staff to walk down with children attending full days. There will be further detail in a letter about this trip which will be going out soon.
- To help get your child ready for this trip, it would be a good idea to pop down to the cornerstones with them for a visit.
- This trip event is for our older N2 children only, those in the 2 year old base or 'rising 3s' in the main nursery will be able to attend next year when they are that little bit older.

Beginning of term dates

- 8th January INSET DAY Nursery is closed to all children
- 9th January Orientation Day
 - Nursery is open for orientation sessions and welcome visits for new starters.
 - Nursery is open to children attending for full days (30 hour and top up sessions)
 - Nursery is closed to children attending 15-hour places in the main nursery (i.e. mornings or afternoons).
 - > The 2 year old base will be closed
 - ➤ We are trying to balance the needs of new children with existing parent's childcare needs. If your child's group is not listed above as able to attend, but this causes you a problem with work, please come and talk to Sarah.
- <u>10th January</u> Nursery opens as normal for all children.
 - If your child will be new to the main nursery (moving up from the 2 year old base), please come on the specific start date which has been shared with you in our starting nursery correspondence.

School Places

Parents or carers of children born between **1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020** (inclusive) need to apply for a primary or infant school place for their children by 15th January 2024. <u>Didcot Community Larder</u> - A community larder is a 'pop-up' hub, a place to access food that is surplus, make friends, access additional services and save money on your bills. Community Larders are not food banks and some larders have been set up like your average store. Community Larders are unique in their own way, "reducing food waste, creating opportunities, engaging with communities".

Housekeeping



Lydalls Nursery School continues to be a mobile phone free site, so please ensure you do not use your phones anywhere on the premises whilst waiting to drop off/pick up your child. School sites are private spaces. The taking of unauthorised photos and videos is prohibited.



As the weather gets colder and wetter, please make sure your child comes to nursery with everything they need of the day, including:

- Hat
- Gloves
- Warm waterproof coat
- Wellies
- Waterproof trousers (especially on Forest School days)
- A pair of shoes to change into when they take their wellies off.
- At least one change of clothes (and ideally 2 or 3).

Please make sure that you write your child's name on all of their clothing and belongings.



When waiting to come into nursery, please make sure that children stay on the pavement. It is not safe for children to play in the car park. Our registration periods are 8.45-9.15 and 12.45-1.00. If your child is struggling to wait, we recommend that your try to avoid queuing and come a little later within the drop off times.









If your child has their ears pierced, they must only wear studs at nursery due to the risk of hoops or dangly earrings getting caught or pulled out.
