**Primary School Applications** 



The application process for primary school places closes on 15.01.24. Children born between 1st September 2019 and 31st August 2020 (or those older children who have delayed their primary school starting date) will be eligible to start their Reception year at primary school during the academic year 2024/25. Please make sure you apply within the given timeframe.

In the summer term, primary schools nearly always invite children for settling visits. At nursery we have a transition week all about starting school and at this time spend group times with children going to the same schools. For this reason we strongly encourage you to resist taking your child on holiday in June or July.

Housekeeping and Site Safety




There are lots of children in our school which means lots of clothing, shoes and accessories which can easily get confused for another child's or lost.

Phones or any device that could take a photo are not to be used once you step onto the site. This includes in the carpark or on the footpath when you are queuing up at drop off or pick up times.



Grapes, cherry tomatoes and other similarly shaped small food— need to be sliced before you give them to young children because, otherwise, they can be a choking hazard. The correct way to slice them is lengthways. Please make sure all such foods are appropriately chopped up if in children's lunchboxes.

# IN-SCHOOL KEEP CLEAR-IN

Please park considerately outside out school. This includes avoiding parking on our yellow school keep clear lines. School Keep Clear markings are there to keep the space outside of schools free from parked vehicles so that children can be seen more easily when crossing the road.

### New Parking Restrictions

We have been informed that parking in the bays opposite the nursery will soon be limited to 30 minutes. Only those with a resident's permit will be able to park for longer than 30 minutes. When we were first alerted to this scheme, we protested that it was not helpful for parents to only be able to park outside of the school for 30 minutes, however the scheme has proceeded, nonetheless. I was told that these things are kept under review and therefore recommend that families contact the council to express their opinion, should the parking situation cause them concern.
